IT

The schools are now over 6 months into the new IT support contract. Aside from many changes to improve the IT provision behind the scenes, there are changes taking place to how IT is used throughout the school.

Thanks to the hard work of the PTA and continued support of parents at events, we are able to purchase interactive TV panels in 4 classrooms across the federation. This is in addition to the 4 new ipads, also funded by the PTA, which are now being actively used within class.

This is a fantastic opportunity to update and enhance classroom experiences for our children.

Questionnaires - Assessment

A big thank you to everyone who participated in the survey on assessment which was sent round recently.

This survey carried extra importance due to the government changes to assessment which has started to impact this year.

On the whole, feedback was positive with the general consensus being that the Schools' provide plenty of opportunity to access information about children's learning and progress.

Some of the key points identified were:

- Overall it was beneficial having children present during discussions with parents.
- · Feedback from teachers was good.
- Parents feel they have the opportunity to engage with teachers outside of this structure and feel comfortable in raising any issues.
- Some children were understandably nervous, but the consensus is that this is an important life skill to develop.

Student questionnaire

In addition to the parent questionnaire, students also took part in their own survey on assessment within school.

When we reviewed this with the children, they all reported they had enjoyed parents coming into school to share their successes, stating 'they now know how to help us improve'.

Both parents and children acknowledged the importance of sharing good news as well as areas that need addressing through shared discussion. This is important as close working partnerships between home and school are most likely to make a difference to children's learning and taking responsibility for next steps.

We will be reflecting on comments shared, to ensure changes in the process this year take account of parent, pupil and staff views. Information will be shared in September, highlighting how we will ensure information about year group expectations is easily accessible to parents. It is currently on the school website and we hope to make regular reference to this throughout the coming year.

Parents are encouraged to make an appointment to see teachers if they are concerned or have questions about their child's progress throughout the year.

Many already do this; please feel free to do so too!

External moderation

Both our schools have received an external moderation visit (KS1) this year.

The feedback we had from the moderators was very positive, particularly about the range of evidence staff presented and the strength of assessment practice in place day to day.

One of the moderators was particularly impressed by the evidence in maths which showed clear understanding and evidence of high quality reasoning and problem solving.
