


In Science, we will be investigating forces

In Art, we will be looking at textiles and collage


As artists, we will be taking inspiration from natural objects to create textile art. We will combine collage and applique techniques to create work that depicts textured surfaces.

As designers, we will be considering the durability of fabrics. We will design and make a drawstring bag. We will use stitching to make a channel for the string or ribbon and backstitch for the seams.

UKS2 How does **tawhid** create a sense of belonging to the Muslim community?

Prior learning

That Allah is the one true God – compassionate and merciful. He should be obeyed in every way.

Muhammad – revered but not to be worshipped - was chosen by Allah to be his final prophet.

Muhammad told people to submit to Allah and to worship no-one else. The greatest revelation has come from Allah to the Prophet Muhammad and is recorded in the Qur'an.

What should we know?

Tawhid is the central Muslim belief that there is only one God and that God is unique.

Muslim's believe:

- There is only one true God.
- Everything comes from Allah. He is eternal and infinite.
- Muslims believe all humans come from God and will go to God when they die.
- Muslims believe all humans exist to serve Allah and obey him.
- All Muslims belong to the ummah, the worldwide Islamic community.

Allah – without limit and without end.

The house of Allah.

One people.

What should we be able to do?

Explain some key Muslim teachings about Tawheed or the one-ness of Allah.

Explain how the Kaaba or 'cube' reminds Muslims that there is only one God.

Recall the Five Pillars of Islam and how the practice of each pillar makes a Muslim feel they belong to the 'ummah.'

Describe the impact of Hajj on a Muslim.
