The addition of the conservatory at Bentley, as an extension to Adders Class, has been a tremendous success and greatly relieved the pressures within school with regard to teaching space, and as a consequence plans are well in hand for a similar extension to Foxes Class at Copdock. All the necessary planning, contract and finances are in place and building should commence during the Easter Break. None of this would be possible without the outstanding support and assistance the schools have received from Parents and the PTA along with private sponsors, Parish council and the "Grow your £10" scheme at Copdock. The latter has been driven by Martin Taylor and one which the children have been successfully involved in. Thank you to all involved in these projects.
