Topic Music PSHE Art	Art: Expression: Kandinsky felt that he could express emotions and music through colours and shapes within his painting. Create a piece of artwork inspired by your favourite piece of music. Listen to the music several times and feel free to draw or paint the emotion you feel at the time.	History: Music of the 20 <sup>th</sup> Century: Using the information from today's blog and this <u>website</u> , find out about the different genres of music that were developed during the last century. You can write notes on the recording sheet on the blog or present your information in a different way – Word, PowerPoint or Publisher. You can research one or two in depth or include lots of different genres.	Science: Sounds Like Science: Download the resource from today's blog. Over today and tomorrow, choose different activities (there are 20 in total!) to have a go at. Don't forget to record your results and to draw/write about what you have done. Make sure you take photos of anything you have created.	DT: I'm with the Band! Create your own musical instrument. This could be a cereal box guitar, drums or shakers. You may even want to make a range of instruments to create a family band. Design your instrument first, drawing a labelled diagram. Decorate the instruments to make them appealing. Extension: Research which famous musicians perform with your chosen instrument and watch videos of their performance to inspire your own!
