### Mozart's timeline



- Mozart was born 1756 in Austria
- 1759 he started playing the harpsicord
- 1761 he wrote his first piece of music
- He had one sister called Maria
- 1769 he toured Italy
- In 1782, Mozart married Constanze who was a singer
- 1788 he wrote his last symphony
- He died in 1791, but nobody knows how he died

### Who was Mozart?



- Mozart is a very famous composer
- He could play the piano, violin and harpsichord (an early keyboard)

## **Mozart – The Composer**

- Mozart never stopped writing music
- He wrote music for piano and violin
- He wrote for orchestras and singers, 'chamber music' for a quartet (4 players) as well as church music
- He is best known for writing operas
- He wrote more than 600 pieces of music

#### Some examples of his music

- Serenade No. 13 "Eine Kleine Nacht-Musik" It may also be one
  of the most well known pieces of classical music ever written
- Overture to "The Marriage of Figaro" Possibly one of the most moving and famous opera overtures of all time
- Rondo Alla Turca -The piece actually consists of three movements with the rondo coming last, being popularly referred to as the "Turkish Rondo"



# Looking fantastic in the 18th Century



- All Mozart's clothes were made by hand
- Tailors and seamstresses made items of clothing for customers
- Materials for sewing included scissors, needles and a goose (an iron that could be heated over a fire)
- Mozart would have worn embroidered coats, vests and knee length trousers



## 21st Century Audiences




- Andrew Lloyd Webber has composed musicals that have been performed all over the world
