5. Which station is at the north east end of the District line?
6. How many stations are there with 'Ruislip' in the name?
7. Is Kew Gardens to the north or the south of the river?
8. Find two stations beginning with B that link to the national rail network.
9. You are travelling with your friend who is in a wheelchair from Fulham Broadway and you want to visit Bond Street . How close will you be able to get and what is the route?
10. How many lines is Hammersmith on?
