4. What is significant about Lavenham?


PSHE: My Emotions/Anti-Bullying

In this unit, we will learn about how to:


- *recognise and communicate how us and others are feeling

As **scientists**, we will be learning forces and magnets.




In **music**, we are learning to create clapping patterns using crotchet and quaver beats.

LKS2 How does a Muslim show their **submission** and obedience to Allah?

Prior learning
The importance of the names 'Allah' and 'Muhammad' to Muslims.
Stories about Muhammad.
The different names of Allah e.g. the doer of good, the generous, which show what a Muslim believes about God.

What should we know?
That **submission** is about recognising that Allah is to be obeyed at all times.
That Muslim's believe:

- That Allah is the one true God; the most important being in the universe.
- That Allah should be obeyed in every way and Muslims trust him to tell them the right thing to do.
- That praying five times a day helps them to remember to submit to Allah in all they do.



What should we be able to do?
Explain how a Muslim responds when hearing the Adhan.
Explain that Muslim means 'one who submits' or who willingly does what God wants them to do.
Explain a Muslim learns from the story of Bilal and the first call to prayer to submit to Allah.
Describe some things Muslims do when they get ready for prayer and how the physical actions show submission to Allah.
Understand that saying the Bismillah reminds Muslims that Allah is involved in everything.

What words should we understand and be able to use?

Submission	For a Muslim this means obeying Allah as creator of all.	Adhan	The Adhan is the Muslim call to prayer performed in Arabic. It announces the beginning of a set period of prayer.
Bismillah	This means 'in the name of Allah.' The first words in their holy book. Muslims says this before starting anything.	Muezzin (mu'adhin)	One who calls the adhan, five times a day, by a muezzin from the top of a minaret (tower on the mosque).
Salat	The ritual prayer of Muslims, performed five times daily in a set form.	Muslim	A follower of Islam. One who submits to Allah.

As **scientists**, we will be learning about uses of everyday materials.



Arthur Wellesley – First Duke of Wellington
(1769 – 1852)



In this block, pupils will investigate materials to discover whether they absorb or resist water. Pupils will also use wax or oil crayons to create a waterproof coating for a paper hat which they have made by creasing and folding a sheet of paper.

KS1 Why was Jesus given the name 'saviour'?

Prior learning:

God is a VIP.
Jesus is God's son. He told parables to teach about God.
Everyone is welcome into the Christian family.
Christians pray to God and worship him in different ways.
The Holy Spirit reminds Christians God is always with them.

What should we know?

Christians believe:

- God decided to show the world how much he loved us by coming to earth as the baby Jesus. This was a wonderful gift.
- Jesus is the saviour and rescuer of the world. He shows people the way to God.
- Advent is a special time of waiting to celebrate the 'coming' of Jesus.



What should we be able to do?

Remember the Annunciation story.
Recognise an advent calendar or candle.
Recall one of the stories about Jesus as a baby.
Describe Jesus as a saviour or rescuer.

What words should we understand and be able to use?

Advent	The four Sundays and weeks before Christmas.	Annunciation	The story in the Bible when the Angel Gabriel told Mary she was going to have a baby.
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
